And here's one more: "I wish I knew....more about John Thomas Doane who was born Dec. 1919 in Los Angeles, CA. His mother's name was Letha Van Householder. She was born in 1903 in Charlaroy, PA. He was known internationally for his research of blood diseases, particularly leukemia. He was named Dean of the College of Medicine in 1944. He reached mandatory retirement in 1960 but continued to teach and

George W. Doane, Born Ebon Marshalls, Micronesia, May 8, 1858; Died March 25, 1860; and Baby Willie, Born Honolulu Jan. 15, 1862; Died May 30, 1862.

"Mr. Doane was taken to Manila, as a prisoner in a Spanish Naval Vessel, June 16, 1887; But he was exonerated by the Governor Gen. and reinstated in the Mission in Sept. 1. He was busy with the translation of the Bible when sickness compelled him to leave. He reached Honolulu Mar. 27, but soon passed to his rest above."

Mark Haidet, son of Imogene Doan Haidet, happened upon this tombstone when he was in Honolulu last summer and copied the information down and brought it back to her. We are curious how this family fits into the Doane genealogy ---- do any of you know???

In a FUTURE ISSUE look forward to the DOANS of DOAN'S CROSSING of Vernez, Texas. This was a spot where tens of thousands of cattle were driven across the Red River on their way to market in Kansas in the late 1800's. I will tell you about these Doans, devout Quakers, peacemakers, who gained the trust of the Indians living in that area. Imogene Doan Haidet
