President's Message

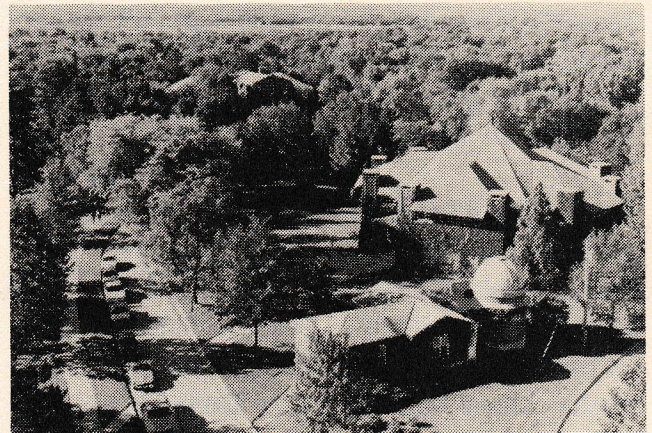

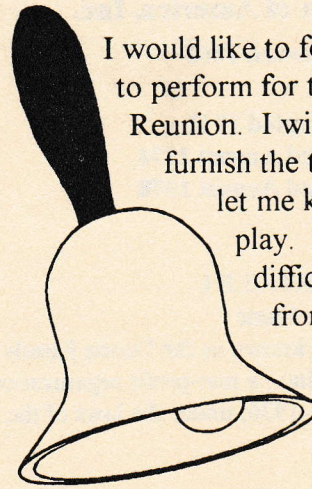

This committee has met and brought forth some proposed changes to the existing Constitution and By-Laws that were amended August 1978.

The DFA membership will act on the proposed constitution and by-laws at the upcoming national reunion to be held at Doane College.

CONSTITUTION

**The Doane Family
Association of America, Inc.**

Founded 1868

**Adopted 1911

ARTICLE I Name

This Association shall be known as the Doane Family Association of America, Inc.; a non-profit organization incorporated on April 20, 1936, under the laws of the State of New Jersey.

ARTICLE II Object

The object of the Association is to research and record genealogical data from all sources pertaining to the Doane Family; to report such information in papers read before the Association; to publish it in pamphlet or book form for distribution to the Association's membership or to other genealogical societies and thus perpetuate the story of the ancestors of the Doane Family and their contribution to the history of America.

ARTICLE III Membership

(1) Persons bearing the name Doane, Doan or variants thereof, the descendants of a Doane, or husband or wife of a Doane are eligible for membership in the Association as well as all others interested in promoting the objectives of the Association.

(2) Members are encouraged to form regional chapters of the Association in order to more easily trace the history of local Doanes and make it available to the Association.

ARTICLE IV Meetings

The National Reunion Meeting shall be held biennially unless changed by a majority vote of the members present at the National Reunion Meeting.

ARTICLE V Administration

The following officers shall be elected for a term of two years by a majority vote of the members present at the National Reunion Meeting:

No Officer shall serve more than five (5) consecutive terms.

ARTICLE VI
Executive Committee

An Executive Committee composed of the President, 1st Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer shall have general management of the affairs of the Association; shall authorize all expenditures and approve or disapprove all budget requests submitted by the Committees of the Association. The Executive Committee shall appoint three members of the Association to audit the financial affairs of the Association and report their findings to the National Reunion Meeting.

ARTICLE VI
Executive Committee

An Executive Committee composed of the President, 1st Vice-President, RECORDING Secretary and Treasurer shall have general management of the affairs of the Association; shall authorize all expenditures and approve or disapprove all budget requests submitted by the Committees of the Association. The Executive Committee shall appoint three members of the Association to audit the financial affairs of the Association and report their findings to the National Reunion Meeting.

ARTICLE VII
Funds

- (1) The General Fund shall consist of all monies received as dues, donations or legacies left to the Association for the normal operation of the Association and the expenses incurred thereto.
- (2) The Endowment Fund shall consist of those monies that have been given specifically to the Endowment Fund, of which only the earnings may be transferred to the General Fund.
- (3) The Hattie Belle Doane Van Hoy Memorial Fund shall consist of those donations given specifically to defray the expenses incurred in reprinting the Doane Family books as well as any other genealogical materials.

BY-LAWS

THE DOANE FAMILY ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA, INC.

ARTICLE I Offices

The principal office for the transaction of business of the Association shall be the residence of the President, subject to change with the election of a new President.

ARTICLE II Meetings

(1) The National Reunion Meeting shall be held at a time and location decided by a majority vote of the members present at the Reunion Meeting.

(2) Questions brought before the meetings shall be decided by a majority vote of the members present.

ARTICLE III Duties of the Officers

(1) The President shall preside at all meetings of the Association; shall appoint all standing committees and be an ex-officio member of each committee.

(a) The President shall have the authority to act on an urgent matter affecting the Association before meeting with the Executive Committee.

(b) The President shall call a meeting of all elected officials prior to the National Reunion Meeting to explain decisions taken by the Executive Committee during the previous years and to brief them on any proposed actions to be taken during the National Reunion Meeting.

(2) The 1st Vice President shall, in the absence of the President or in case of disability, exercise all powers vested in the Presidency.

(3) Regional Vice-Presidents shall form liaison between the Association and Chapters and with Historical and Genealogical Societies in their respective areas. They shall actively work to establish new Chapters from the Association's membership list and bring to their attention the advantages of forming local Chapters.

(1) The President shall preside at all meetings of the Association; shall appoint all standing committees and duties of such, as well as such other committees as may be needed. The President shall be an ex-officio member of each committee.

The 1st Vice-President shall coordinate the activities of the Regional Vice-Presidents.

(3) Regional Vice-Presidents shall form liaison between the Association and Chapters and with Historical and Genealogical Societies in their respective areas. They shall actively work to establish new Chapters from the Association's membership list and bring to their attention the advantages of forming local Chapters.

(4) The Recording Secretary shall keep a record of all proceedings of the National Reunion and the meetings of the Executive Committee; have charge of the CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS; keep a record of the members of the Association; report to the National Reunion Meeting the minutes of preceding meetings and report other matters that pertain to the office of Secretary.

(5) The Treasurer shall receive, hold and disburse all monies received for the Association; keep an account of all financial transactions and give a report of same at the National Reunion Meeting.

The Treasurer shall submit a detailed report, including treasurer's books and canceled checks to the Auditing Committee one month prior to the National Reunion Meeting.

The Treasurer shall have custody of the Association's Investment portfolio and shall receive or release securities when directed to do so by the Investment Committee.

(6) The Historian shall have charge of the historical and genealogical records of the members and all files pertaining to the Doane Family; receive and file data when received from any source; answer all correspondence regarding such material and make such genealogical research as is necessary to maintain accurate files. The Historian shall not do personal research for members.

The Historian shall have custody of all volumes of THE DOANE FAMILY and shall present one copy to those donors who make a minimum contribution of \$100.00 to the Hattie Belle Doane Van Hoy Memorial Fund.

(7) The Corresponding Secretary shall reply to all inquiries about the Association and refer relevant correspondence to the appropriate committee.

(8) The Chaplain shall have charge of and conduct all devotional activities of the Association.

The Regional Vice-Presidents, at least once a year, send annually a list of their Chapter membership, and should report, at least once a year, a list of the Chapter activities to the 1st Vice-President.

Three (3) new Regional Vice-Presidents shall be elected at each Doane Family National Reunion.

(5) The Treasurer shall receive, hold and disburse all monies for the Association; keep an account of all financial transactions and give a report of same at the National Reunion Meeting.

The Treasurer shall, at the National Reunion Meeting, have a printed financial report for each person attending the National Reunion.

The Treasurer shall submit a detailed report, including Treasurer's books and canceled checks to the Auditing Committee one month prior to the National Reunion Meeting.

The Treasurer shall be an Ex-Officio member of the Investment Committee.

(6) The Historian shall have charge of the historical and genealogical records of the members and all the files pertaining to the Doane Family; receive and file data when received from any source; answer all correspondence regarding such material and make such genealogical research as is necessary to maintain accurate files. The Historian shall not do personal research for members.

(9) There shall be appointed by the President, at each National Reunion, a Custodian for all DOANE FAMILY genealogical books published by the DOANE FAMILY ASSOCIATION of AMERICA, INC.

The President shall appoint the following Committees to serve for two years.

(1) A Nominating Committee to select and place in nomination a slate of officers for the ensuing term of office.

(2) A Membership Committee to send out literature and an application to prospects who will become members upon payment of dues to the Treasurer and upon receipt of a membership card.

(3) A Proceedings Committee to secure from the Secretary all reports, papers and events of the National Reunion as well as such copy and photos that are available from other sources, and publish same in pamphlet form to be sent to each member of the Association. All Reunion Speakers shall make available to the Committee a copy of their remarks.

(4) A Reunion Committee to make all arrangements for the National Reunion and send notification of the time and place of same to each member. The Committee shall also send a copy of the Reunion Programme to each member, showing the itemized cost per person.

(5) A By-Laws Committee to prepare revisions to the Constitution and By-Laws when so directed by the Association and submit same for consideration to the membership.

(6) A Committee for the Preservation of Genealogical Records to have general supervision over all Association records and to determine the best methods and the best places to adequately safeguard them.

(7) An Archives Committee to supervise the preservation of all Doane Family memorabilia given to the Association.

(10) A Memorial Committee to receive names of deceased members between reunions and to conduct a suitable memorial service at each reunion.

(11) Each Committee shall submit a proposed budget to the Executive Committee before the National Reunion Meeting. No debt shall be incurred without prior approval by the Executive Committee.

(12) A Parliamentarian appointed by the President shall advise the Presiding Officer upon matters of procedure and shall rule upon points of order according to "Robert's Rules of Order"

Part of this was a business plan on who is interested in saving the house, what it could be used for, and what the short and long term costs and responsibilities would be. Needless to say, this will be an ongoing topic for discussion and more will be said later.

New Jersey-Pennsylvania-Maryland Chapter News

The 1993 meeting of the NJ-PA-MD Chapter was held October 16 at Widow Brown's Plumsteadville Inn in Plumsteadville, Bucks County, Penn. It seems appropriate that we hold our meetings there as this quaint old inn was reportedly owned by members of the Doane family during the late 1700s and early 1800s.

The NJ-PA-MD chapter is the second oldest in existence follow only the New York Chapter. Our chapter is experiencing a resurgence of interest, especially in the last few years, since we have held "the gathering of the clan" at "the old homestead" and have had a luncheon meeting plus a guest speaker presenting an historically significant program. Since adopting this format, our attendance has increased over 80 percent from 22 in 1991 to 34 in 1992 and 40 in 1993.

Chapter President Diane LoPresti welcomed everyone, especially National President Dorothy Doan Baker and her husband, John, and National Historian Emma Barrows and her husband, Frank. Along with their names, the tombstones contain the word "outlaw." These two members of the "Doan Gang" add color, interest and a little mystique to our family's history.

We will again have tables set up to display pictures, articles, books, etc. We thank all those who brought items to share with the group and encourage everyone to bring items of interest for display at our 1994 meeting.

Due to the realities of old age, she has not attended meetings in the past several years; however, she has maintained an interest in the local chapter news and national activities.

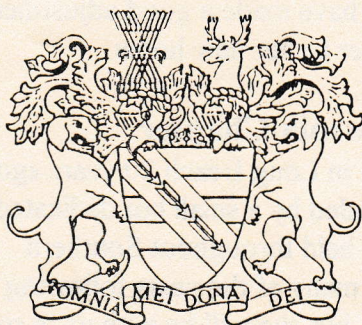
