

#### Significant Records Are In Danger Of Being Lost

The problem:

- The average age of a Korean War veteran is approaching 65.
- Personal papers, combat records, journals, and pictures will be lost if not collected and preserved within the next 10 years.
- The Center for the Study of the Korean War is the only archive devoted to collecting and preserving the records of the Korean War veteran. It cannot be done without your help.

#### **Center For The Study Of The Korean War**

The Center for the Study of the Korean War is a not-for-profit corporation dedicated to archiving the "forgotten war" and remembering its veterans.

The Center currently houses and has available to the public, documents, personal letters, photographs, diaries, memoirs, official orders, maps, oral histories, tapes, memorabilia, personal histories, pilots' logs, command reports, ship newsletters, as well as manuscripts contributed by veterans and their families.

Nowhere else will you find, in one place, more commercial films and published manuscripts regarding the Korean War. In addition to collecting works, the Center has independently published four significant works of annotated bibliography concerning the Korean War, including a book on films and one on poetry inspired by the Korean War.

The Center for the Study of the Korean War serves the public as the only archive of its kind, and serves the Korean War Veterans Association as its historian's office.

## **Obituaries**

Oscar W. Doane, Jr., 77, West Chatham, Mass., past president of Doane Family Association, died Aug. 30, 2000. He was married to Victoria Hoole Doane for 55 years. A native Cape Codder, he attended Chatham schools and graduated from New Bedford Vocational School in 1942. He worked for Igor Sikorsky Helicopter Co., in Stratford, Conn., until his enlistment in the U.S. Coast Guard during World War II. After the war, he worked for Hoole Import Export Co., in New York City for four years. In 1986, he moved back to Chatham and worked for Cape Cod Mosquito Control Project. He was superintendent from 1958 until his retirement in 1997. Doane was an advocate of Cape Cod Regional Technical High School. He served as director and vice president of the Cape Cod Cooperative Bank. He was a member of the Barnstable County Retirement Board for 16 years, a former commissioner of the Bass River Golf Course, a member of St. Martin's Lodge F & AM of Chatham, and one of the original members of the Chatham Town Band.

In addition to his wife, Victoria, he leaves three daughters: Katherine Christy of Richlands, N.C.; June L. Bianchi and Virginia H. Doane, both of Chatham; a son, John W. Doane of Chatham; a sister, Barbara H. Hart of Alexandria, Va.; six grandchildren; a greatgrandson; and several nieces and nephews.

The second was a three-part clear bottle, California Port whiskey, distributed by John S. Doane Co., of 149 & 151 Blackstone St., and 12 & 14 Endicott St., Boston, Mass.

established in 1866. In looking in *The Doane Family*, Volume #1, page 473, I located a John S. Doane, born June 1, 1841. It states he is in business at 149 Blackstone St., Boston, Mass.
