PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings cousins and friends!

October, 2016

The 54th Reunion of the Doane Family Association of America, Inc., held in Salt Lake City, Utah was a great success. Our numbers were down a little bit, but those in attendance had a wonderful time visiting with cousins from all over. The tours and opportunities to research our ancestors were well attended, and all owe a great big thank you to the reunion committee chaired by Dick and Mary Doane of Arizona.

Of interest to all was the fact that all meetings did not last as long as scheduled, which left more time for visiting, and checking out Salt Lake City and the many historical

things that could be seen in the area.

The presentations were extremely interesting, especially the slide show that Brian Doane (NH) showed of the various Doane/Doan/Done items in his collection, some of which were on display in the registration room.

It was good to see first time reunion folks in attendance, and it was reported that new DFA Chapters are being worked on.

One important item of business was the establishment of an endowment account for the Doane Family Foundation. This will allow anyone to make a tax deductable donation to the foundation that will be held for investment purposes with all or a part of the increase being used to award scholarships to college bound individuals. It may take a few years to build up the account, however it is the intent to make the foundation depend on its own endowment account for this purpose, and not to fully depend upon the DFA Endowment Account for scholarship purposes.

Dr. James E. Doan made a donation of \$5,000.00 with the stipulation that it is matched with \$5,000.00 of new money from the membership and friends of the DFA on or before November 30, 2016. As we go to press, we are quite close to raising this amount. A goal of \$50,000.00 was set before any funds would be used for scholarship purposes, so please think serously about making a donation to the Doane Family Foundation, Inc. prior to the end of this year or at some point in the future. The foundation can accept not only cash, but can accept donation of securities. In fact one of our members is in the process of making a donation of stocks that will be beneficial to the donor and to the foundation.

The 2018 Doane Family Association of America, Inc. reunion is being planned for the Washington D. C. area, with Jane MacDuff (VA) as chairperson. We all look forward to seeing you there!




Library and the Family



She is collecting data for a biography of Helen Perry Curtis, daughter of first Doane College president, the Reverend David Brainerd Perry and his wife, the former Helen Doane. (#1298, Vol. 2) Curtis was the granddaughter of Doane College (now University) founder, Thomas Doane. (#500, Vol. 1) Curtis was a fascinating woman who had a career as an author, designer, textile collector, and museum curator among other activities. She made her home in New Jersey, but was a world traveler, with a life-long, passionate interest in studying other cultures. National DFA Chaplain, The Venerable William H. Fineout, age 69, died on June 14, 2016, after battling cancer for several years. Bill was a Michigan native, the son of Jane Ann High and Donald S. Fineout. He had a 30-year career as an educator, and served as a librarian, athletic director, football coach, state champion cheerleading coach, and English teacher at Fowlerville Community Schools. After retiring from education, he completed studies in ministry, and was ordained to the permanent diaconate in 2008. He served at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Lansing from 2007-2013, and was appointed Archdeacon, Episcopal Diocese of Michigan on February

2013. In his role as DFA chaplain, Bill helped to organize and officiated at the memorial services held during each biennial national reunion. Bill is survived by his wife Shannon, and daughters, Kathleen "Kassy," and Jill and their families.

Who is John Done?

At the 54th DFA Biennial Reunion this past July in Salt Lake City, UT, Richard T. Doane, Chairperson of the "Deacon John Done Research and DNA Committee" presented a report to the DFA Board of Directions. A shortened version of his message was that his volunteer Committee does not have an answer to the above question. Despite the documentation of over six thousand plus vital records, searching and deciphering many wills and probates, apprenticeship, school, census and tax records since our last reunion, the Deacon continues to elude us.

However, the Committee is encouraged by the most recent news. A few weeks prior to our reunion, Derek Done, Past Chairperson of the Research Committee, from Marlow, England, had what he referred to as an "eureka" moment. Derek discovered a National Geographic YDNA participant who matched closely other participants in our "Doane Family DNA" data base (www.familytreedna.com). Derek has since been in contact with the donor, born in Walsall, Staffordshire, England, whose surname is spelled "Dowen".

We shouldn't be surprised by the name found by Derek as there are many variations to the spelling of the surname including: Doane, Doane, Done, Donne, Donne, Doen, Dowen, Dunne, Doune, Le Donne, etc. Surnames were not as important in the 1600's as they are today and it was often the case that the person couldn't even check on the spelling written down by scribes as they were unable to read and write themselves.

Recent advancements in the use of DNA for genealogy purposes have given us hope that this will be the path to finding our Deacon. In very simple terms, DNA research is relatively new and involves only a swab of the inside cheek and a return of a kit to the company doing the scientific research to determine their "markers" which are compared with others in the database. It is the male, or "Y" chromosome, passed from father to son, which gives the best results. It is a new learning curve and we are most fortunate to have several on the Committee who

making are effort every to learn the significance of DNA. process requires great care to ensure there are breaches privacy issues. In November Chairperson Richard Doane and Dr. James Doan will be attending a major DNA Convention to keep up-to-date on the latest developments.

The focus of the Research Committee now is to find several other "Dowen Boys" who will agree to be tested in order to compare the results (known as markers) even further. We are sending out invitations to potential participates, and advertising our search in several genealogical Midland publications for this purpose. Respecting privacy issues we are asking participants for any information they are willing to share about their ancestors (i.e. grandfather, great-grandfather, etc.) If they wish an ancestry chart will be worked on for their own use. To complement the DNA research we need to have a paper trail and this is what the Research Committee will be looking for so we can eventually narrow the search for our progenitor.

If you know of any "Dowens" in the Midlands area of England (including the counties of Derbyshire, Herefordshire, Leicestershire, Lincolnshire, Northamptonshire, Nottinghamshire, Shropshire, Staffordshire, Warwickshire), we would like to hear from you. If you know of any "Dowens" who have emigrated from this same area we would also appreciate this information. The DNA test would be free of charge and the DNA Committee chooses who will qualify to be part of this important research. Please send an e-mail to maurdoane@bell.net.

As more and more records become available on the internet (ancestry, family search, family history, etc.) our Research Committee wishes to express a word of caution. There are many erroneous family trees out there in cyberspace. Many of them are for Deacon John Done. There is an approved agenda when determining who your ancestors are based on proof positive facts available through official records for births, death, marriages, etc. Don't fall for the pranksters. If you have a question about the legitimacy of a family tree, ask for the paper trail before accepting it as fact.

The Research Committee welcomed two new members at the 54th DFA Biennial Reunion this past July in Salt Lake City, UT. They are Rebecca L. Doan and James R. Campbell. Both are already enthusiastically contributing to the intense search for the origins of Deacon John.

We hope that the next DFA newsletter will have even more positive news. You will be kept posted on the latest.

Post Script News: We have made contact with our "Eureka" DNA contributor who has been included as part of the Doane Family FTDNA site. In addition another "Dowen" is considering his options to join as well and the Research Committee will work with both to complete and study their family trees.

"Old Blackfoot"

Frontier History with a Doane Connection

ED NOTE: This account of "Old Blackfoot," a missing muzzle loading rifle once owned by a Doan, was shared by Nebraska historian/reenactor, Les Vilda.

Ron and Eugenie Webb Maine of Rhode Island, hope to find an old muzzle loading rifle that became known as "Old Blackfoot" in the 1830s, due to its use in Blackfoot country, and is still referred to by the nickname in the current muzzle loading community. This rifle was in the Webb family until 1978 when Eugenie's father, Henry H. Webb sold it during a time when he lived in Hyannis, Massachusetts on Cape Cod. Henry's ancestor, James Josiah Webb, was a prominent trader along the Santa Fe Trail during the 1840s. George P. Doan was one of his business partners. (George was the first child of Job Parker Doane and his first wife, Henrietta Dix – see #354, Vol. 1 and #968, Vol. 2) Note that in the Doane family genealogy books, this family of Doanes spell their name with the "e," but in frontier history volumes and documents of the time, George P. Doan is not using the "e."

Les Vilda, a Doane University alum from Wilber, Nebraska, took on this mystery since he is a frontier educator with a great knowledge of the Santa Fe Trail, and also travels in the circles frequented by other reenactors and scholars with a passion for the frontier. He hopes to help Eugenie, the great-great

granddaughter of James Josiah Webb, find the rifle so that she can get photographs of it.



In brief, the story is that "Old Blackfoot" was gifted to George P. Doan by Charles Bent, of the Bent, St. Vrain, and Company (owners of Bent's Fort near present day La Junta, Colorado). Later, Charles Bent was appointed as the first Territorial Governor of New Mexico in 1846 and was killed during the Taos Uprising of 1847. George P. Doan traded the rifle to James Josiah Webb, his business partner at the time, for a double barreled shotgun. James Josiah Webb kept the rifle and in 1846 had it reconditioned. The Webb family remained in possession of it for nearly 135 years. The family believes that the transaction may have taken place with a collector in the Cape Cod area. Since the sale took place before the internet era, the family believes that it would have been more difficult to find a collector/buyer outside of that area.

Vilda also thinks that maybe, since Henry H. Webb probably knew the story of "Old Blackfoot," and its George P. Doan origin, he may have tried to contact a Doane family member to return/sell the rifle to descendants of its original owner. With Doane family members still living in the Cape Cod area, this certainly may have been a possibility.
